PROJECTS and GRANTS

Fencing and indoor work space! This has been a priority for the last year. We desperately need a (minimum) 60 x 80 indoor arena for therapists and doctors to hold sessions with our horses. Included in the design would be 1065 feet of split rail wood paddock fencing in order to provide a fully functional, professional.

The cost of fencing: \$24,800.

The cost of an indoor works space: \$78,000

We have a pledge for \$12,500 toward the total cost. Every dollar counts! The more we raise through public donation, the more likely a foundation is to contribute or match those dollars.
